Report Short-term student exchange –Barcelona (ES) 2019 – C2

The second Short-term student exchange was organised in Spain from 1-5 April 2019. A hostel was used for the accommodation with breakfast for the pupils and a nearby hotel for the accompanying professors. The students had lunch at the Instituto Nautico de Barcelona, and a cost-effective solution was found for dinner. A 50-seater coach was used for transfers during visits to the company premises and the Maritime Museum, while public transport was used for internal transfers. Sporting activities were also carried out to show students rescue techniques.

Although only 10 students were envisaged in the project, the Capellini-Sauro Institute decided, given the importance of the exchange experience, to send 20 students, directly bearing the cost of the 10 students not envisaged. Lycee Rouviere sent 9 pupils. All the pupils were selected from among those who were most willing and interested in doing the work experience in a foreign country. The participants demonstrated specific requirements highlighted by the entry assessment forms administered at the beginning of the school year. Pupils had sufficient knowledge of English, which enabled them to break down territorial and linguistic boundaries, demonstrating interest and ability.

The students were accompanied by the teachers of their school and the 5 transnational exchange days were "Full immersion" with activities in companies, visits to the partners' facilities and moments of meeting the local realities with the main objective to provide new knowledge on specific activities/jobs related to their studies and secondary objective to make them European citizens..
